PMP Overview

- Started Data Collection in October 2011
 - Average more than 900,000 records a month
- Provider Access began January 2012
 - Over 9,500 Prescribers
 - Over 3,200 Pharmacists
 - Average over 30,000 requests a month

SB 5034 (section 219)

- The proviso requires DOH to do two things:
 1. Integrate with EDIE
 2. Request Insurers and Third Party Administrators to provide to EDIE:
 - Primary care provider name & contact info
 - Care or treatment plans for patients with higher utilization of services

- **Pre-requirements**

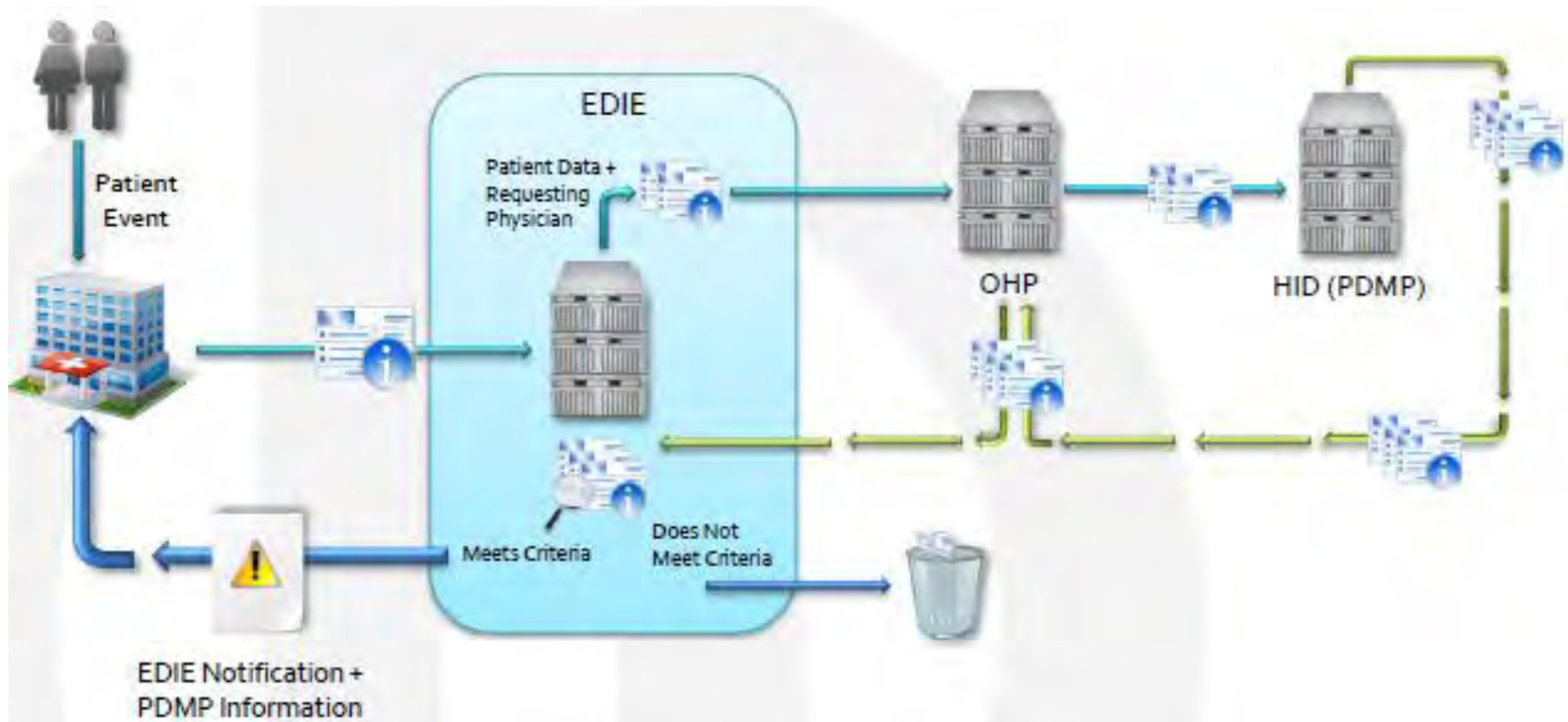
- Requestors of medication history from the DOH PMP repository have registered in the Prescription Review service online at <http://www.wapmp.org/practitioner/pharmacist/>.
- Any organization planning to automate the queries can request to use the license of a Medical Director and must contact the Department of Health PMP program director for education and information before implementation.

PMP/OHP Connection

The response provided from the PMP database via the HIE is:

- A real-time transaction based on the authentication of the requestor's license (pre-registration of the user in the online PMP system) and...
- A match of the patient record requested
- The request and response utilize the NCPDP Script standard for medication history.
 - OHP HIE is utilizing the NCPDP 2013.12 standard.
